Priorities for 2014-2015

Introduce more extra-curricular activities to engage children in sport and exercise

Dance club: 11 sessions @ £25 = £275.00

Football club: Weekly @ over time rates for TA

During the academic year 2014-2015, children were provided with the opportunity to take part in variety of different after school sports clubs. These were organised, planned and run by enthusiastic teaching assistants and outside agencies. Dance was introduced as a new club and was a popular choice with Key Stage girls at the beginning of the year.

Develop the outdoor adventurous activities aspect of the PE curriculum

Outside agency @ £5848.51

The majority of funding for 2014-2015 was used to improve the quality of outdoor adventurous activities; part of the key stage two PE curriculum. This was done through the employment of an outdoor specialist for one half term, which ensured all teachers were given the opportunity to team teach and develop their knowledge of the subject area. The investment has also provided thorough lesson plans for all year groups (excluding Nursery) to continue to access adventurous outdoor education provision in the future.

Introduction of house system

House point tokens @ £444.00

House winners shield @ £88.85

During 2013 a house system was introduced throughout the school. Children were split vertically into four different groups. At the beginning of the academic year of 2014 tokens were purchased to provide house points. These are used to reward children for achievement in PE. The tokens are collected via deposit boxes on the PE display and totalled at the end of the year. The winning house is rewarded with the shield for the year.

Other spending

Equipment @ £598.05

Transport @ £60.00

Skipping workshop @£700.00

Further spending was made to ensure equipment was up-to-date for PE lessons. This has included the purchase of new footballs, netballs and basketballs as well as an electronic pump.

Children were also provided with the chance to take part in a skipping workshop which proved very popular.

In order for children to take part in different activities it has also been necessary to fund transport.
